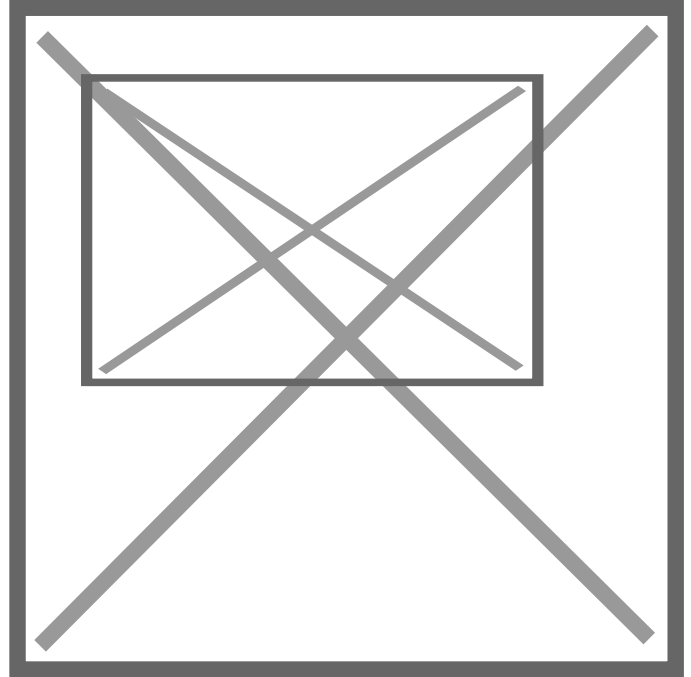


Intermountain helps with “Stuff for Students”
