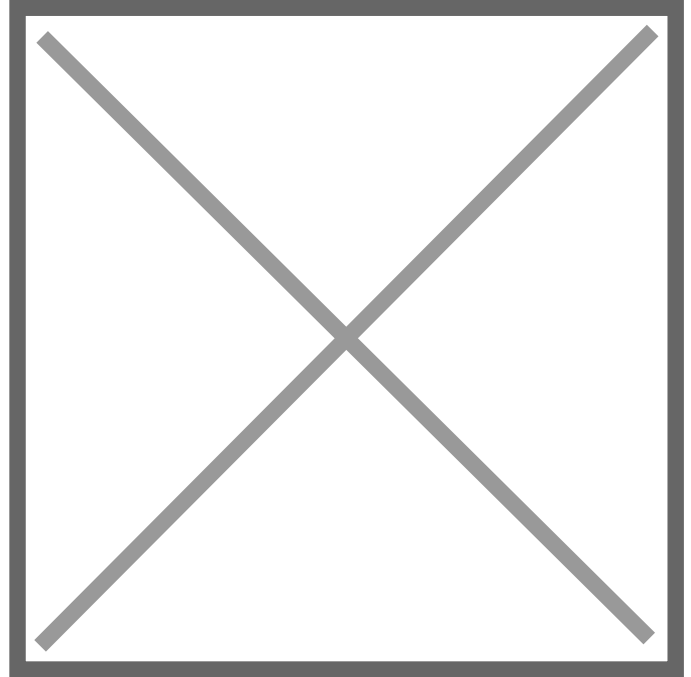
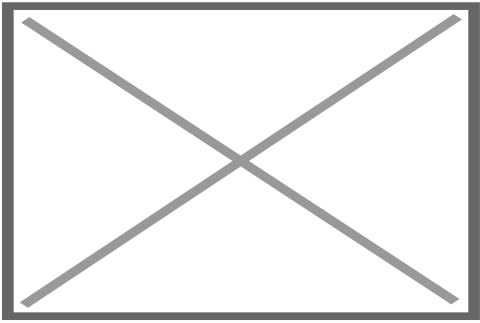


Klotz-Collins Aids NAB from Phoenix
