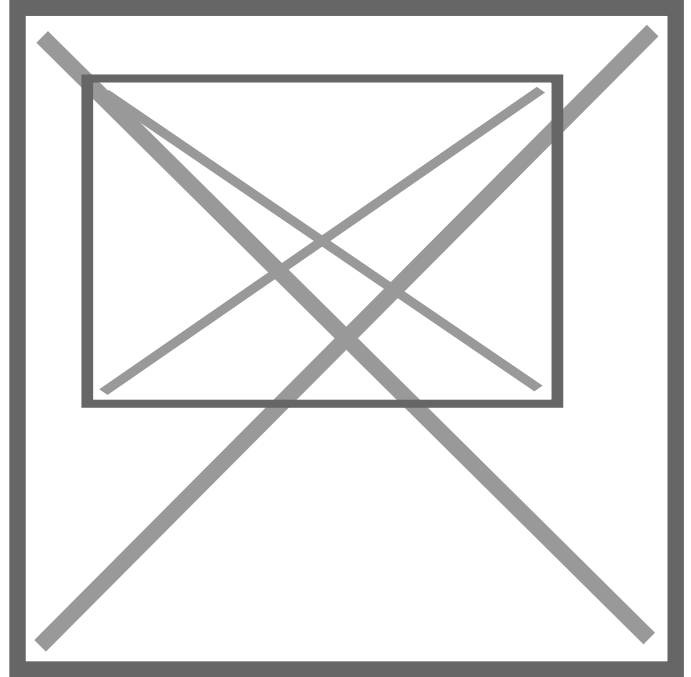


Salvation Army helps fire victims in India
