While in recovery, beneficiaries engage in work therapy, helping to process the donated goods for sale in stores or to be recycled

A warehouse is commonly divided into:

- \cdot Home goods $\ \cdot$ Appliances and small electronics
- Furniture
 Accessories
- Mattresses · Bicycles
- Vehicles
 · Books

Garments – Clothes account for some 40 percent of Family Store sales, and beneficiaries and staff typically process 12,000 pieces of donated clothing each day across the U.S.

Ecommerce – Many centers scour donations for items to sell on eBay. Shop the finds at go.usawest.org/eBay.

Recycling – Damaged or worn clothing and cardboard are processed into 1,100-pound bales that are sold to recyclers. In turn, this keeps millions of pounds of waste and electronics out of landfills.

The Salvation Army opened its first "cheap food and shelter establishment" in the U.S. on Dec. 23, 1891, calling it "Our New York Lighthouse." Thirty-six men were given food and shelter in exchange for the promise of two hours work in the morning—washing dishes, cleaning up, or chopping and sawing firewood. This premise developed into the The Salvation Army's Adult Rehabilitation Center (ARC) program, which today provides spiritual, social and emotional assistance to men and women—with no government funding.

- Holistic work therapy
- Group and individual counseling
- Spiritual direction
- · Life-skills development
